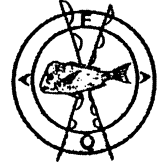

### The Junior Caravan

The Junior Caravan is now complete ready for this week ends succession shield fishing competition. Jim and Ricky have worked hard recently to finish off a few things.

The official opening will be on 3 May after the general meeting.

### AFAQ Fishing By-Laws

The catch and release by-laws were discussed during the last general meeting. It is important to release the catch in good condition and below are some suggestions the best way of handling fish.

*7.3 Fish out of water cannot live for more than three or four minutes because of brain damage caused by the lack of oxygen. Return the fish to the water as soon as possible. Do not let it flop and flail about.*

*7.4 An exhausted fish played too long may not recover. Retrieve your fish as quickly as possible. Undue stress can be caused by the use of ultra light tackle. Consider using heavier line and tackle that is appropriate for the size and type of fish targeted to land it sooner.*

*7.5 Improper handling can easily damage fish. Even though the fish swims away, extensive damage is likely to cause death. In some cases this may be days later. The damage is usually caused by interference with the slimy protective coating (mucus) on the fish that forms a natural barrier to bacterial infections. Damage can also occur by removal of scales or even disrupting the natural set of the scales. This allows easier access for bacteria and other infection. Using the following methods can lessen damage to fish.*

*7.6 Use a landing net with a fine soft mesh and no knots. A tough mesh will often scrape the body, removing mucus, while knotted mesh can remove scales and damage flesh.*

*7.7 Handle fish with wet hands. Dry hands can transmit infection and remove protective mucus. Gloves that are wet, open weaved and knotless are good for handling purposes.*

*7.8 Place the fish on a wet and preferably soft surface. A wet cloth spread over an even flat work area is ideal. Dry surfaces of any substance (wood, metal or plastic) damage fish. Cover the fish's eyes.*

*7.18 Each member competing in the catch and release division is to fill out a log with the competition details, specie of fish and its length for each eligible fish caught and released. The release of each fish is to be witnessed by at least one other member and signed off accordingly. Members fishing by themselves may retain their catch in a suitable container such as large esky or live bait tank fitted with aerators (keeper bags and buckets are not considered acceptable) and they must conduct regular water changes whilst seeking verification / witnessing and recording.*
