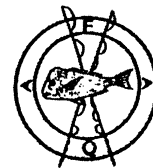

A-Team trip to Fraser Island, 2009

Neville and Noel departed Brisbane and picked up Merv at the Bribie Is turnoff. The unfortunate late scratching of Greg and Willo meant we had a contingent of 6 for the week. We were to be housed in a new place, Bennets, just below the Marloo Chalet we had last year. Greg had been trying desperately to get there, but in the end, time just beat him. Bad luck mate, you both were missed

A snack at the Matilda and booked into the rainbow beach resort, as usual. Tradition continued with a trip to the bowls, club, won a meat tray and \$25 of lotto tickets at the raffles, another excellent meal with a good wine and off to bed

Saturday

Hi tide was early, so a late start. We had rumors of problems with hook point, the beach and particularly soft sand at Indian head. Got the barge around 10.30, would have been one of the first batch around hook point, hard sand all up the beach, Indian was a breeze, good sand and drove over with one leg in the air. Beach between and Indian and Waddy nice and hard. Despite all expectations of doom and gloom, one of the easiest trips I have ever done to Waddy.

Booked in and unpacked, Merv, our resident butcher just could not help himself with some good meat. We will not be hungry. We went fishing to test the waters. Not a tailor in site at Waddy or up the beach towards Ngkala. Plenty of good size dart saw no other species caught. Neville's eyes lit up.

Neville merv and myself had a mixed grill (our raffle winnings) for dinner that night. This was the first time for many years that we did not have a fish meal on the first night. Tin plums and custard for desert.

Sunday

Down to the beach, again, Neville rigged for Dart and to my ever shame, I must admit to all that I eventually changed my tailor rig to dart rig, almost. That is if a heavy 17ft surf rod, 40 lb line 5.0 sinker and a 60 lb trace can be classified as a dart rig. Of course not successful. Sorry folks, wont do that again!!!!

Neville and Merv landed 8 good size dart and we were advised that tailor were being caught at Ngkala

Drove up there, National parks had a road closed sign on the by pass, a lot of cars on this side, and some fishing off the rocks, Tracks indicated that there seem to some traffic on the bypass despite the sign. Good oil from fishermen was plenty of tailor on other side, and road closure due to a fatal accident on the bypass the previous week. No tailor seem to being caught on the southern side of Ngkala

Went home, Dowdie, ian and Chris arrived, and unpacked. Too late for another fish, so I baked up the dart tubes with stuffing and red wine sauce, mashed potatoes and mashed sweet potatoes. Could almost say it was a fish meal, but well accepted. Again tin fruit and custard for desert

Monday

After brekkie, headed north to Ngkala. Road closed sign removed, don't know if this was by National parks or fishermen. Waiting throng advised that there had been a bogged car on the track for some time, but thought to be cleared now. The guys had a bit of a walk up the hill and returned to say that Dowdies vehicle with the low gas tank would not negotiate some of the deeper ruts.

Decided to give it a go, and Neville, Merv and myself up and away. Not too bad and as we descended to the beach, saw a herd of tailor fishermen all catching tailor. Found a spot and Neville and Merv into it. Mine was a little slower, as I have to set up my chair just above the water line, and get everything ready.

Oh Joy, a tailor with the first cast reasonable quality, better than choppers. I did not know that this was to be my swan song. All this time Neville was killing them, with Merv struggling a bit. Another 4 casts, spaced did not produce a fish, although I did get a charity fish, a guy fishing for dart caught a tailor on his dart rig, and gave it to the poor old pensioner sitting the chair, as he only wanted dart.

I had exceeded my quota of casts for the day, and was about to go back and see what the other from were doing when Ian appeared, he had walked around the rocks. Dowdie did try to drove over, got bogged and

was lucky enough to have a couple of helpers to get him back. We went back, Dowdie and Chris were fishing but no bites, and we decided that I would ferry them back to the other side. Packed up and again, away we go. With a full complement, again chasing tailor. Neville was still killing them. We finished up with 58 tailor. Did not keep an individual record, but Neville's day by a long margin. I ferried all gear back to the other side, and we headed home.

Had a beer at the trading post pub, Neville had to be provided with a pair of thongs to meet the dress standards. Proprietors informed that fisheries inspectors were talking to guys on the beach yesterday confirming the new limits of 20 tailor (not 30 as previously) Beer batter tailor and beer batter potato scallops with a salsa on the side tonight. Ice cream with Neville's cumquat liquor for desert

Tuesday

Looks like the a team will not be any threat for the Fraser shield again this year, just no sizable tailor being caught. After Brekkie, back up the beach.

I ferried group over Ngkala, Dowdie was crook and stayed home, wanted to console himself with the rose' and the bold and the beautiful. We got there a bit late to day and guys were packing up. Still caught 8 fish, better quality than yesterday, but a lot of fishermen were targeting dart

Arrive home so see that Dowdie and rose' had survived. He was smoking his chicken wings tonight. I cooked up a mess of tailor fillets dusted in flour with salt and pepper, with a tossed salad. Desert, plums and custard, ice cream and cumquat and generally leftovers.

Wednesday

Neville and Noel got away at 7.00am. Noticed a scrum on the southern side of Indian head, and tailor being caught. Tried to phone Dowdie, but he does not turn his mobile on to save the batteries. Could not let them know. Go Ian's mobile and contacted him that night.

Sand a bit softer on the way back, and a bit of a slog from time to time. Had to use the internal road, would have been too late for hook point. A good trip home and slept well that night. The balance of the team went down to Waddy and decided to fish for dart on light gear We got a heap of dart the whiting gear what fun!! Not much else though Went to the pub afterwards to talk about the day

Thursday

Another early start Decided to head north towards Ngara to see if the tailor were somewhere else No joy Ended up back at Waddy Mrev got a 50cm tailor and Ian a reasonable flathead Got another good haul of dart Absolute fun to catch on light gear After lunch Dowdie decided to bring out his 50s and 60s CDs and he backed the car up to the front steps and we had a music session for a feew hours

Friday

Not an early start Not the music The tide Back down to Waddy Chased the dart again but Dowdie perservered for tailor Justly rewarded with a green back that went 52cm To top it off he got a 55cm flathead while winding in slowly (because he was tired) A great catch Chris also caught a sea mullet on line (no jaggig with trebles) so a good catch also Maybe a bit lucky!! We also got a lot of dart Probably about 50 we kept over 3 days We did not keep any under 35cm!! Back to the house to clean up Our "friends" next door drove by for their late afternoon fishing singing loudly "Tell Laura I Love Her" Obviously loved our choice of music the day before

Saturday

Good trip back to Rainbow Beach and home abony 1.00pm
